PREFACE

The Bharati Vidyapeeth's Bharati Vidyapeeth's Matoshri Batabai Shripatrao Kadam Kanya Mahavidyalaya, Kadegaon. Dist. Sangli (M.S.) 415 304 has been reaccredited by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in March 2012 with an "A" grade and CGPA of 3.13. This accreditation is effective for five years until March 9, 2017. Meanwhile, it is expected to submit Annual Quality Assessment Reports (AQAR) by 30th September every year, in the format provided by NAAC.

The format helps the departments to plan and conduct the activities that enable Quality Assurance, Quality Enhancement, and Quality Sustenance.

This manual aims to provide clarifications on the items included in the format for which information is sought by NAAC and thus to simplify and expedite the related work.

From now on wards follow the definitions given here. Distinguished persons who are invited on special occasions or give a lecture of one hour/two hour duration, or who conduct workshops etc., are Guest Speakers. Guest Speakers should not be counted under Guest or visiting faculty.</p>
