Communication is the process of sending information from one person to other person. It is useful for sending and receiving messages. It is a two way means of exchanging information in the form of opinion, views and ideas between two or more than two persons. The cycle of communication works with the help of sender, message, coding, channel, decoding, receiver and feedback. In general, the communication is completed through spoken and written forms. Sometimes, there is the use of graphical representation in the process of communication.

In the cycle of communication, at first, the sender starts conversation. Further, the sender encodes messages and uses proper channel to send the

message. Here, the sender selects an appropriate channel like letter or email for sending messages. The selected medium for sending message is important in the communication. Further, the recipient receives the message and decodes it. After proper decoding and interpreting the message, the receiver sends feedback to the sender. When the sender receives the feedback, the cycle of communication is successfully completed.
