Chocolate Malted Snacking Cake

Malted milk powder somehow makes this chocolate snacking cake taste wholesome rather than decadent. It is a great after-school snack cake when served with a tall glass of milk. If this is too plain for your children’s taste, you can cover the top of the cake with a half recipe of the chocolate ganache glaze (without the chopped butter finger R bar) and sprinkle the glaze with 1/2 cup of crushed malted milk balls.

- a) Preheat the oven to 350°F. Grease an 8-inch square baking pan and dust it with flour, knocking out any extra.
