Yashwantrao Chavan was born on 12 March 1913 in the village of Devrashtrre in Satara District (now in Sangli District) of Maharashtra, India. Chavan lost his father in his early childhood. His mother taught him about self-dependency and patriotism. From his childhood he was an active participant in the struggle for independence of India. During his school days in 1930 in Karad, he was fined for his participation in the Non-cooperation Movement led by Mahatma Gandhi. In 1932, he was sentenced to 18 months in prison for hoisting the Indian flag in Satara.

In 1938, after obtaining his B.A. degree in history and political science, he joined Law College of Pune. After obtaining his law degree (LLB) in 1941, he started practice as a criminal lawyer at Karad.


During his years in college, young Yashwant was involved in many social activities and was closely associated with the Congress party and its leaders, such as Jawaharlal Nehru, Sardar Patel and Keshavrao Jedhe. In 1940, he became President of Satara District Congress.

He was the first Chief Minister of the state of Maharashtra. Yashwantrao Chavan, often referred as the architect of modern Maharashtra. He was the also Deputy Prime Minister of India. He holds the record of being the only Maharashtrian leader who held the 4 most important portfolios in the Union government: Home, External Affairs, Defence and Finance. passed away on this day in 1984.
